Subject: RECOMMENDATION OF LOCAL PRIORITIES FOR STATE PRESCHOOL AND GENERAL CHILD CARE FUNDING

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Superintendent of Schools approve the Child Care Planning Council's priorities for California Department of Education (CDE) Child Development Program funding and sign the attached State Report Form.

**DISCUSSION**

The San Luis Obispo Child Care Planning Council (SLO-CCPC) is the County's designated child care planning council per previous Board action (1991). Pursuant to the language in Assembly Bill 1542, Chapter 270/97 (Education Code Sections 8499.3 and 8499.5) the Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools are mandated to be involved in the local child care planning process through:

- Reviewing needs assessments,
- Setting priorities for State funding to meet the needs of underserved populations or geographical areas,
- Appointing SLO-CCPC members and establishing their terms of service, and
- Designating two persons to assist the California Department of Education with reviewing and scoring of child care services applications.

Assembly Bill 1857, Chapter 655/98, made revisions to several education code sections regarding the base allocations to counties, allocations according to priorities set by Child Care Planning Councils and their review of child care programs funded by California Department of Education.

SLO-CCPC reviewed the data collected and narrowed the list to the most underserved areas in San Luis Obispo County. This list was then presented at a public hearing March 7, 2012, the priorities were determined and approved by the Council Members.

**OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/ IMPACT**

County Board of Supervisors, Economic Opportunity Commission, Child Care Resource Connection, County Department of Social Services, City of San Luis Obispo- Parks and Recreation Department, City of Morro Bay- Parks and Recreation Department, YMCA, Cuesta College, Cal Poly ASI Children's Center, County Health Agency, SLO Child Development Center, Housing Authority of San Luis Obispo, center and home based private child care programs, parents, and community representatives. SLO-CCPC links with many other children and youth focused groups in San Luis Obispo county and statewide. The expansion of State funded child development programs benefits the entire community, as children enter school healthier and ready to learn.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

No cost to the County; draws from State funding of over \$85,000 per year.

**RESULTS**

This item will allow the County to meet the State mandate to approve priorities recommended by SLO-CCPC and draw State funding into the County to assist with the implementation of early care and education programs. This action will result in more children thriving and ready to learn when they enter Kindergarten.
