FIRST 5 THRIVE FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Background: As our community continues to build strength during these uncertain times, First 5 SLO County stands united with children and their families and with the organizations who serve them. To

that end, First 5 has allocated up \$900,000 through June 2024 toward one or more "big idea" proposals that create or expand significant value to the local system of helping young children and their families thrive. First 5 is inviting child and family centered service providers to submit proposals that seek to create or increase support for children prenatal to age 5 and their families in one or more of the three focus areas of its FY 20-24 strategic plan: *Child Health & Development, Early Learning, Resilient Families.*

- Proposals may:
 - Expand capacity of existing services.
 - Enhance or improve existing services.
 - Expand and enhance existing services.
 - Create new or innovative approaches to address existing needs.
- Letter of Intent Submitted August 23rd
- Proposal Due September 10th

Council's Proposal supports expansion of the Council to be support/facilitate an integrated child care system that offers support of our local mixed-delivery system. Motion to approve moving forward and apply for the First 5 Grant made by consensus.
