The San Luis Obispo County Child Care Planning Council is a 15-member appointed advisory board working in partnership with families and the community to plan for and promote the highest quality and accessible services for the care of all children and youth.

What Does the Council Do?

- Conducts child care needs assessments, used to determine local priorities and for the development of strategic plans
- Informs the community regarding the importance of high quality, early learning experiences for all young children
- Distributes educational stipends through the Child Care Salary/Retention Incentive Program (CRET) to eligible Title 5 program staff
- Coordinates trainings for professionals in the early childhood field
- Works with the County and its seven incorporated cities to bring high quality early childhood services to local communities.
- Collaborates with groups such as the business and faith based communities to address local, early childhood needs.
- Advocates for children and early childhood professionals

ANALYSIS



WE ARE THE CARE

The We Are the Care Initiative was created as a result of the "Where's the Care? Town Hall" that was hosted in May 2019. The town hall was hosted by First 5 SLO County with support of local stakeholders including the Child Care Planning Council members and staff. The event featured speakers from all over the state representing the private sector and government side of addressing child care needs and exploring the challenges and beginning to problem solve.

Focused on creating a Family Friendly Workplace Toolkit for Employers

COLLABORATIVE CHILD CARE STUDY

The Child Care Study is a collaborative effort of multiple public sector entities to examine the landscape of child care in San Luis Obispo County and determine a suite of viable options that can facilitate progress toward a vision that all employees have access to quality affordable child care. The study will examine current human resource policies and procedures, city and county ordinances and regulations and workforce development.

LPC Priorities Report

California Education Code (EC) Section 8499.5 (a) through (d) requires the LPCs to review local State and Federal data and provide the CDE with an updated listing of their local child care and development funding priorities by May 30 every year. EC Section 8279.3 specifies that LPCs must identify local funding priorities for the distribution of any new state general child care and development and new preschool funding to promote equal access to child development services across the state. These priorities must be based on direct impact indicators of need.

MONTH OF THE CHILD

Council staff begun coordination of the 42nd Annual Children's Day in the Plaza event, celebrating April as Month of the Child and Child Abuse Prevention Month. This year's event was to be held on Saturday, April 4, 2020 in order to help achieve the strategic goal to improve the recognition of the value and need for high quality child care/learning programs while providing resources for families. In light of information shared by the Governor in early March through the California Department of Public Health to cancel or postpone large gatherings that include 250 or more people, the San Luis Obispo County Child Care Planning Council, decided to cancel this year's Children's Day in the Plaza.

Council staff pivoted to provide more of a presence on social media for general child development information as well as community resources and supports available.


